

1st Thursday / Wind S.W fine weather in the forenoon
but turned cloudy about 12 o'clock

Mr. Bourne embarked for York Factory
and left him to pass the summer. J. H. Harriet James
Wright, Thomas Jamison, James Johnson, Donald Fraser
William Houston, James Leitch, John Mcintosh, Peter
Miller & Abraham Leitch.

3 tents of Cree that were tenting at
the house pitched away

2nd Friday / Wind S.W cloudy weather a heavy shower of
Rain in the forenoon

Three men employed getting some wood
for watch house Post 2 taking down the Blacksmiths
Shop the rest employed working in the Gardens

Some Canoes and Battans, passed down
the River to day

3rd Saturday / Wind S.W fine weather

Two men employed putting up the watch house
the rest employed in the Gardens.



4th Sunday / Wind S.W fine weather

The Hiuntas and some Indians that arrived
here pitched away to live till such time as may
give them to hunt for us -

5th Monday / Wind S.W cloudy weather with light show-
ers of Rain

Sent 4 men to the River to cut down and bring
to the River 50 Sticks and 12 Logs for boats - the other
men

June 1st / Men employed building wash houses

2nd Tuesday / Wind S W fine clear weather
Men employed as yesterday

3rd Wednesday / Wind S W fine clear weather
Men employed the same as before
The Hunter and party that went off the 4th inst arrived he having hurt his foot he could not go out.

4th Thursday / Wind S E cloudy weather
Sent James Wright and 4 men down the River in a Boat to bring up stockades they had about 2 o'clock with twenty sticks

5th Friday / Wind N E Cloudy weather began to Rain about 1 o'clock and continued all night
The 4 men that went to the pines the 5th inst arrived they having brought all the wood down the River the other 5 went for stockades and returned with 20 sticks.

6th Saturday / Wind N E raining hard all day consequently the men are not employed
Transplanted 100 Cabbage Plants

7th Sunday / Wind West. weather overcast with light showers of Rain at intervals
Transplanted 130 Cabbage plants

8th Monday / Wind West weather overcast
Five men employed bringing up stockades in the Boat the rest are taking them from the River

9th to the camp - The Hunter went hunting today and returned in the evening with the meat of 1 Red Deer and 1 Jumping Deer

10th Tuesday / Wind S W fine weather
Five men bringing up stockades as yesterday the other 3 sawing them in two

11th Wednesday / Wind S W fine weather
Men employed at the stockades

12th Thursday / Wind W fine weather
Four men employed at the stockades 2 hoing Potatoes & 2 making a washhouse

13th Friday / Wind S W fine weather in the forenoon but began to Rain very hard about 12 o'clock and continued all the night. The men were employed in the forenoon as yesterday but was obliged to leave off work when it began to rain - Transplanted 250 Cabbage plants


14th Saturday / Wind S E fine weather
Men employed as before - an Indian that went away to look for horses killed a Red Deer about 4 miles distant

15th Sunday / Blowing fresh from the westward part clear and part cloudy weather
Sent the Indian for the meat of the Deer that he killed yesterday

16th Monday / Wind S W fine clear weather
Five men employed sawing 4 at the stockades & 2 hoing Potatoes -
Transplanted 100 Cabbage Plants

- June 20th Tuesday / Wind S.E. fine weather
Men employed as yesterday. Sent the Hunter and 2 Indians a hunting, our winter meat being now expended. Transplanted 500 Cabbage Plants
- 21st Wednesday / Wind NW. weather very sultry
Two Men employed making a wattle house & sawing 2 boxes Potatoes and 2 taking down the old storeroom
2 Indians arrived from the north side but brought nothing with them to trade
- 22nd Thursday / Wind SW. weather overcast
Men employed as yesterday. The Hunters arrived with the meat of 1 moose & 2 Red Deer
- 23rd Friday / Wind SW. weather overcast
Men employed as before
- 24th Saturday / Wind SW. fine weather
Two Men sawing buck wood for staves the rest employed as before
- 25th Sunday / Wind N.E. fine weather
- 26th Monday / Wind N.E. fine weather
Sent 4 Men down to the Pines to collect and stack 500 Building Logs the other 4 variously employed at the House
Sent the Hunter a hunting with 6 Boys
- 27th Tuesday / Wind N.E. fine warm weather
Men at the House variously employed
Transplanted 150 Cabbage plants

- June 28th Wednesday / Wind N.E. very sultry in the forenoon and began to Rain very hard about 1 P.M. and continued till night
Sent 4 Men down the river in the Boat to fetch buck wood for making charcoal and they returned in the afternoon with a boat load
The Hunters arrived with the meat of 2 Moose 1 Red and 2 Jumping Deer
- 29th Thursday / Wind N.E. raining weather
Men at the House employed as before
W^m Taylor with 4 Men arrived in a large canoe on their way to Camonton House
- 30th Friday / Wind N.E. weather overcast. light showers of Rain in the afternoon
Men employed as before W^m Taylor in embarked for Camonton House - 14 Southern Indians arrived from across the South Branch River, they came from a camp of 200 tents which had gathered to go to war but did not go, the Indians returning much sooner this summer than usual will make us very backward in our work as nothing can be done while they are about the House
- July 1st Saturday / Wind N.E. raining hard all day consequently the men are not employed - the Indians that arrived yesterday could not go away on account of the Rain
- 2nd Sunday / Wind N.E. raining weather
the Indians went away in the evening
- 3rd Monday / Wind N.E. fine weather
Men employed fetching a boat load of buck wood

Sent the Hunters a Buffalo hunting, also 2 men up the
River in the boat to bring down what meat the Hunt-
ers may take. The others 2 men are employed hoing
Potatoes

5th Wednesday / Wind SW^{ly} cloudy weather light showers of
rain at intervals. Men at the House employed as yes-
terday

6th Thursday / Wind N^{ly} rainy weather
Men employed as before. The boat arrived
with the Meat of 4 Buffalo Bulls which the 26 cents
killed about the Elbow -

7th Friday / Wind N^{ly} cloudy weather
Men employed repairing the Indian fences

8th Saturday / Wind W^{ly} raining hard all the forenoon
but cleared up about 1 o'clock
Men employed hoing Potatoes -

9th Sunday / Wind SW^{ly} cloudy weather

10th Monday / Wind variable weather overcast
Men employed weeding turneps
20 Stone & 2 Cur Indians arrived from the Eagle
Hill Creek. they being the survivors of a Battle having
taken place between the Stone and Tale Indians
in which there was 19 of the latter and 3 of the former
killed. About 20 men Stone and Cur Indians arrived
in the afternoon from another quarter they being
no more. Some of them had arrived in the morning and
away

July 11th Tuesday / Wind N^{ly} fine clear weather
Two men employed burning charcoal & making a
platform down the track. 2 of the men that were at
the pens arrived for provisions - they have now got 300
Logs cut down but only about 50 Matted

12th Wednesday / Wind SW fine clear weather
men employed as yesterday.

13th Thursday / Wind N^{ly} weather very sultry
Men employed as before - 22 Cur arrived from the
South branch River with a few Moor. Skins

14th Friday / Wind N^{ly} fine clear weather
Men employed as before. part of the Indians that
arrived yesterday went to the M^{rs} House and the
others wait here till they come back
Sent the Hunters a hunting in the woods
there being no Buffalo near

15th Saturday / Wind variable about day break this
morning we had a very heavy thunder storm from the
westward which blew down one of our houses and laid
all the barley flat on the ground which was coming
on very finely. all the men employed in the garden
except the Blacksmith who is attending the coal kiln
The Indians that arrived the 13th inst went away

16th Sunday / Wind N^{ly} with light showers of rain
in the forenoon - Four Cur arrived from the
House. they brought 11 Moor & 6 Swan Skins which
they traded and went away again
One of the Indians that went off
with the Hunters arrived with part of a Moor Deer

1830

July 17th Monday / Wind Wth very hot weather
no Provisions of any kind in the House consequently
by the men did not go to work. Later in the evening
another of the Indians arrived with half a Moose
Deer which he traded with us

18th Tuesday / Wind SWth very hot weather
Sent 2 Men to the Pines with 54 lbs of Meat for the
men that are working there and to bring home
a load of Sticks at the same time the Blacksmith
attended his Coalbins & employed making a sh
any

19th Wednesday / Wind S. raining all day consequently
by the men are unemployed
The Hunters arrived with the Meat
of 2 Moose and 1 Red Deer

20th Thursday / Wind N. E fine clear weather
Two Men employed carrying out the wood of the do
House that tumbled down short ago. Blacksmith at
tending his coal bins and 1 employed at Carpenter
work

21st Friday / Wind Wth Cloudy weather with light
showers of Rain Sent 1 man to the Pines with
140 lbs of Meat for the men that are working there
Several Indians came from the NWth House for a
supply of ammunition as they are going to Pite away
tomorrow

22nd Saturday / Wind SW fine weather
Two Men employed carrying up and putting by the ch
coal & employed at the garden - 2 of the Men that were
at

July 22nd at the Pines came home today they have now got 500 lbs
cut down but only 100 Sticks
14 Cows arrived from across the South Branch
but brought nothing with them

23rd Sunday / Wind Sth fine weather
Sent the 2 Hunters a hunting with 6 Horses
The 2 Men that came from the Pines yesterday
went off in the afternoon with 150 lbs of Meat - the Indian
that arrived yesterday went away

24th Monday / Wind W fine weather
Men variously employed

25th Tuesday / Wind NWth Cloudy weather
Commenced making Hay.

26th Wednesday / Wind W fine weather
Two men employed cutting and making Hay
The Hunters arrived with the Meat of 2 Moose and
3 Red Deer one Cow arrived brought 2 blades of
Fat which he traded and went away again

27th Thursday / Wind N. E fine weather

28th Friday / Wind SW very hot weather

29th Saturday / Wind SW very hot weather

30th Sunday / Calm very sultry weather
Sent the Hunters a hunting

31st Monday / Calm very sultry weather
1 Cow arrived from fighting Pines

August 15th Tuesday / Wind W cloudy weather

Sent 2 Indian young men to the 26 vesters tent for meat. 4 Crows arrived from the dark Lake brought nothing with them to trade. 1 Stone Indian arrived he came for the horse that a Crow brought him a few days ago which he took and went back again.

16th Wednesday / Wind West fine clear weather

This 4 Indians that arrived yesterday went away. 1 Stone Indian arrived from the 26 Crow Hills.

17th Thursday / Wind S E weather overcast

The Indian that arrived Sunday went away. 15 Crows arrived they went away some time ago to steal Horses from the Slave Indians they filled in with 10 tents of Blackfoot Indians but being able to get the Horses away they fired on the tents in the night time and say they killed five.

18th Friday / Wind S E fine weather

John Budge with 2 Indians arrived in a small canoe from Cumberland House with 2 Hides of Tobacco. 17 Indians arrived but brought nothing to trade.

19th Saturday / Wind S E fine weather

Men have been employed making Hay all the week. The Indians that arrived yesterday went away.

20th Sunday / Calm very dreary weather21st Monday / Wind NW fine clear weather

Three boys are dead in the House to give them they did not go to work today - in the evening the Indian arrived with the head of 3 animals.

1820

August 22nd Tuesday / Wind W cloudy weather raining at intervals
Men employed cutting oats.

37 Stone Indians arrived from the Touchwood Hills but brought nothing with them to trade they came to get a pipe of Tobacco and 2 of the Crafts had not yet arrived from below. Sent the Indian young men down.

23rd Wednesday / Wind W fine weather

Men employed binding the oats that they cut yesterday. The Stone Indians that arrived yesterday got a pipe of Tobacco and went away. 2 others arrived they have been at the upper House from which place they stole some Horses and were pursued by the Crows who killed 1 of them. They brought 2 Horses here but we do not know who they belong to.

24th Thursday / Wind S W cloudy weather

Mr. Taylor arrived from C P in a small canoe just as the Stone Indians that brought the Horses yesterday were going off. He knew the Horses to belong to some of our people above and we took them from the Kawale and they went away. 108 Crows arrived. They are on a war expedition they brought about 150 Moose skins to trade ammunition as they passed the house.

25th Friday / Wind S E fine weather

The Crows that passed here yesterday returned from the NW Lake - 13 Stone Indians arrived for a pipe of Tobacco.

26th Saturday / Wind S W fine weather

Men employed cutting oats. The Stone Indian that arrived for Tobacco yesterday got a pipe and went away.

Sept 27th Sunday / Wind W fine clear weather
The Indians that went a hunting the 23rd are returned
with the Meat of 3 animals

28th Monday / Wind N E cloudy weather we had a very
severe hail storm to day that flattened all the Indian
stuffs

29th Tuesday / Wind W cloudy weather with light showers
of rain at intervals - Sent James Knight up the River
in a boat also some Indians with Horses a Buffalo hunting

30th Wednesday / Wind W fine weather
The man that is at home is employed cutting Barley

31st Thursday / Wind W fine weather
James Knight and party arrived with the Meat
of 7 Buffalo chiefly young Bulls their bearings come
to be found - 2 Tent of Cree pitched their tents at the
House

Sept 1st

Friday / Wind S W fine weather
Men variously employed

37 Stone Indians arrived from the south
they were 5 days coming they came for a piece of
Havers for one of their Chiefs the man that had the things

2nd Saturday / Wind S E fine weather
Men employed cutting Barley
The Stone Indians that arrived yesterday went
away sent 1 pair of Havers by them for the Chief

3rd Sunday / Wind S W fine weather
5 Stone Indians arrived

9

Sept 4th Monday / Wind W fine weather
The 4 Men that were at the River came home to day
50 Tent of Stone and 12 of Cree Indians pitched their tents
at the House the Stone Indians as a little provision
with them to trade

5th Tuesday / Wind N E cloudy weather with a good
shower of Rain in the forenoon

Men employed so attending the Gardens to
prevent the Indians stealing. The Stone Indians
traded part of their Provisions

Richard Colin with an Indian arrived
from the mouth of the Deseret when he left Mr
Heron coming up in a boat. 2 Cree arrived from the
North side but brought nothing with them to trade

6th Wednesday / Wind S W cloudy weather
Men employed watching the House and Gardens as
the the Indians are still at the House and are very
troublesome for them and I have more to give them
till the Boat arrives

7th Thursday / Wind S E cloudy weather rained very hard
all the afternoon - Mr Heron and Mr Lewis arrived in
a Boat with Havers - Mr Heron gave me a tub of
part of which I gave the Indians as a present the rest
they traded with their Provisions

8th Friday / Wind S E cloudy weather
Men employed watching the House and Gardens
Messrs Heron & Lewis embarked for Cambridge House
The Stone Indians have been very troublesome since the
little River I got from Mr Heron was gone and will
no better but what I have given in the House

1820

14th Saturday / Wind N.E. fine weather
Men employed cutting Barley
The Horn Indians that arrived traded what they brought and went away.

15th Sunday / Wind N.W. cloudy weather

16th Monday / Wind E. fine weather
Men employed as follows - 5 cutting wheat 3 digging Potatoes 2 digging a cellar and 1 attending the Herd - sent some Indians about hunting with 9 Horses

17th Tuesday / Wind S.W. fine weather
Men employed as yesterday

18th Wednesday / Wind N.W. fine weather
Men are employed as follows - 6 Mending Hay 2 cutting wheat and the rest digging Potatoes
The Indians that went about hunting on Monday arrived with the Meat of 7 Red Deer

19th Thursday / Wind N.W. cloudy weather
4 Men employed cutting wheat and the rest digging Potatoes

20th Friday / Wind N.W. fine weather
4 Men employed digging a cellar 3 digging Potatoes and 1 making a temporary Barn for the skinning the beaver into - 3 Cows arrived brought a Moose Head and a little and Meat

21st Saturday / Wind N.W. fine weather
Men employed as yesterday - 5 Horn Indians arrived from the Eagle Hills but brought nothing with them

1820

9th Saturday / Wind N.W. rainy weather


10th Sunday / Wind N.W. cloudy weather
Part of the Indians pitched away

11th Monday / Wind S.W. fine weather
Men employed watching the Gardens
Most of the Horn Indians went away to day
3 Boats arrived from below on their way to Hammer District

12th Tuesday / Wind S.W. fine weather
Men employed cutting Barley and watching the Gardens

13th Wednesday / Wind N. fine weather
Men employed as yesterday
The 3 Boats that arrived on Monday brought 9 tents of Cows pitched their tents on the opposite side of the River some of the Men came ashore in the evening - gave them a treat of Rum which they took up to their tents

14th Thursday / Wind N.W. cloudy weather
The Cows that are tenting across the River have been trading Rum with leather and Provisions
20 Horn Indians arrived with some Provisions to trade.

25th Monday / Wind N E fine weather
 Men employed as follows - 4 reaping a culvert trucking wheat 2 bunging home Hay and 2 gathering wheat to the barn.

26th Tuesday / Wind N E fine weather
 Men employed as yesterday 2 tents of crew pitched then tents at the house - engaged 2 Indians for winter. Hunters gave them 8 lbs of mixed Sam each.

27th Wednesday / Wind N E fine weather
 Men employed as before - 1 Storm Indian arrived but brought nothing to trade.

28th Thursday / Wind N E fine weather
 Men employed as before - about 20 Storm Indians arrived with some Provisions to trade.

29th Friday / Wind N E fine weather
 Four Men employed building a small house the rest as before. The Storm Indians went away.

30th Saturday / Wind N E fine weather
 Men employed as before - most of the crew that were tenting at the house pitched away.

Oct 1st Sunday / Wind N E fine weather
 2 Indian young Men arrived with the head of 3 Red Deer - The Hunters pitched away.

2nd Monday / Wind N E fine weather
 Men employed as follows 4 building a small house

 Oct 2nd / Four 2 trucking and 2 gathering wheat and 1 bunging home fire wood -

3rd Tuesday / Wind N E cloudy weather
 Men employed as yesterday. Sent 2 Indians to look for some Horses that is lost.

4th Wednesday / Wind N E fine weather
 Men employed as before 1 Storm Indian woman arrived with a little Provisions to trade.

5th Thursday / Wind and weather as yesterday
 Men employed as follows 3 building the faye 2 building an oven 3 carrying Storms 2 fetching Hay and 4 trucking and gathering wheat - 3 Storm Indian young Men arrived gave them a piece of Tobacco each and they went away - The old woman that arrived yesterday traded and went away.

6th Friday / Wind N E fine weather
 Men employed as yesterday
 3 Storm Indians arrived from the north side of the River brought nothing with them to trade - about 20 crew arrived from the Back Hill brought a good quantity of Provisions and Leather.

7th Saturday / Wind N E cloudy weather
 The crew that arrived yesterday traded and most of them went off - 12 Storm Indians arrived with some Provisions to trade.

8th Sunday / Wind N E cloudy weather
 The Storm Indians that arrived yesterday traded and went away -

A Mr. Cannon passed down river with 5 Men and 8 oxen I understand they came up for provisions from Cumberland. The 2 Cows that arrived yesterday got paid for the Meat they brought took some iron work on Debt and returned to their tents
- 18th Wednesday / Calm clear fine weather
Men employed as yesterday -
Geo Sutherland with some Cows arrived from the South branch River - with some leather and provisions to trade
- 19th Thursday / Wind S.W. fine cloudy weather
Men employed as before - the Boat arrived with the wood and Meat that they went for -
- 20th Friday / Wind S.W. fine clear weather
Men employed as before
Geo Sutherland and party took call and went away

1820
18th in a boat down the River in search of Bushwood for Meat and on their way back they are to take out among the Hunters have at their tents and who are trading within a few miles of the River below. The man that came home with meat on Saturday returns and is to take the Meat that he left at the tents down to the River for the Boat to take in. The other six Men which I saw yesterday is all hands when I expect my cook and second hand are employed putting their own Houses in the best shape they can to prep the winter

12th Thursday / Wind N.W cloudy weather
Sent 3 men to Cumberland and 2 boats with a loaded - id with dried provisions - Men at the house vanony employed - The Stom. Indians that arrived yesterday traded and went away

13th Friday / Wind N.W weather overcast
Men employed covering the roofs of the houses with mud and straw -
